IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

12v or 24v POWER: 12v or 24v battery power only <u>(For best performance use 24v)</u> Unplug or turn OFF unit when not in use. Lightning & electrical surges can cause unattended operation. Powering unit OFF helps however, disconnecting the unit is the safest method of protect unit from such damages while away.

CONNECTION: The battery wire should be less than 20ft in length for proper performance. Connect the Lake Lifter motor to a battery power source using the supplied power cable with safety FUSE and inspect regularly for good condition.

FUSE: ALWAYS use a fuse between the battery + connection and motor + wire. If the fuse blows: Boat lift may have serious problems or motor may be faulty.

12v or 24v POWER: Use marine deep cycle battery or AMG batteries. *Note:* LiFePo4 Batteries NOT recommended due to BMS & cold weather limits & issues.

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Operating Instructions:

- 1. Ensure electrical cords are connected to GFCI power source and are not dangling in the water.
- 2. Turn the power switch to the ON position (lighted).
- 3. Insert Key into key switch and turn the motor UP to raise the boat lift and DN to lower the boat lift.

IMPORTANT: The motor should turn **clockwise** when lifting the boat. If the direction is opposite, then **STOP** immediately and reverse direction. The cable of the lift is wound on the drum backwards and must be corrected or serious damage may occur to winch, boat lift, or boat.

Remote Operation

- IMPORTANT: **NEVER** operate Key turn switch or key fob buttons at the same time. Damage will occur.
- 1. Press the UP button on the key fob to raise the lift.
- 2. Press the DN button on the key fob to lower the lift.
- 3. Press the LIGHT button on the key fob to activate the light (auto shut-off after 15 mins).
- 4. Hold the STOP button for 10s to enter programming mode (follow prompts).
- 5. Press the STOP button to stop the lift (only when in Auto-Run mode).

SYNC KEY FOBS: Turn motor on, within 6 seconds hit any button on fob. UNSYNC ALL KEY FOBS: Hold down the light button for 20 seconds.




Backup Drill Drive

IMPORTANT: DO NOT use an impact drill: Use a standard drill in NON-IMPACT mode!

- 1. Use 9/16" deep well socket. Insert through hole under motor and secure onto the motor shaft.
- 2. Operate drill to lower or raise the boat lift.
- 3. NOTE: A powerful drill is necessary. It may be IMPOSSIBLE to raise the lift by drill with the boat on the lift.

Winch Box – Installation & Cable Length


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
STOP: IMPORTANT!

Fully lower the boat lift, remove the boat and any weight from the boat lift carriage. The cable should be slack. Ensure the lift carriage is fully down.



Lift Post Attachment


IMPORTANT: Check with boat lift manufacturer for exact installation instructions, hardware, methods, & procedures.




Cable Length

Pull cable up and around winch drum then back out the bottom of the winch box. Pull the cable tight.

Mark the cable at 2-3" past the bottom of the winch.







Wrap the cable cutting area with tape to ensure a clean cut.

Use a grinder/cutter to CLEANLY cut the cable:


Wrap the cut end of cable with tape to prevent fraying & unraveling while installing.


Winch Box – Cable Wedge & Maintenance

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Cable Wedge Attachment


Ensure there is approximately ½-1" of cable exiting the narrow end of the wedge. Lift a small amount of weight to ensure cable does not slip before adding full weight to lift.





Cable incorrectly exits wedge furthest from the drum side. Cable tension may push the short side out of the wedge and cause the cable to slip out.

Cable is not sticking out past the wedge and will easily slip out of the wedge when weight is applied to the cable.


Inspect cables for damage & fraying




Lubricate winch & lift pulleys annually

Lubricate the winch box moving parts annually or as needed to improve performance & longevity.

Lubricate the chains, sprockets, and bearings under the plastic exterior caps and on the inside of the winch box.







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DOWN LIMIT NOTICE:


DOWN Limit is NOT based on water depth. The lower limit of the boat lift is not determined by water depth, but rather by the point at which the lifting cable still maintains tension and weight from the lift. This occurs just before the lift reaches the bottom and the cable becomes slack. It is crucial to ensure that the cable does not become slack at this lower limit.




UPPER LIMIT WARNING:

User MUST set upper limit before the boat collides with any obstacles such as lift canopy <u>OR</u> the lift's maximum lifting height. Failure to follow this important step may result in catastrophic damage to the boat, lift, cables, and/or pulleys. In such a scenario, the lift may break, causing the vessel to drop and potentially lead to property damage, serious injury, or even death. DO NOT OVERLOOK THIS CRITICAL SAFETY ISSUE.

AUTO-RUN MODE – <u>NOT PERMITTED</u> DO NOT enter Auto-Run mode if the upper limit is set with a

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Programming Digital UP & DN Limits (Auto-Stop)

Programming UP & DN Limits:

- SET LIMITS: Hold the STOP button on the key fob (approximately 10-seconds)
 Programming mode will be activated (Follow voice prompts)
- 2. 1st LIMIT: Move lift to the 1st position & press STOP button (1st limit is set)
- 3. OPTIONAL MIDDLE LIMIT: Press the LIGHT button at the desired boarding height or location between the two limits.
- 4. 2nd LIMIT: Move lift to the 2nd position & press STOP button (2nd limit is set)

The boat lift will now only operate between these two limits.



IMPORTANT: NEVER operate lift outside its travel limits. Each lift's operating range is different. User must know where to set limits & when to stop lifting or lowering to prevent damage to boat lift or vessel.

🚹 IMPORTANT: AUTO RUN MODE WARNINGS: 🛕

WARNING: <u>DO NOT</u> use Auto Run mode if you have a Bimini or wake tower requiring lowering inside the lift. Neglecting to do so may cause serious damage to the boat, lift, cables, and motor, risking injury or death



ENABLE AUTO RUN: NOTE: Auto Run includes (Auto-Stop): (LIMITS MUST FIRST BE SET)

- Turn system power switch OFF
- Turn key switch to the UP position and then turn power ON, After powered on release key switch

DISABLE AUTO RUN: (Return to Normal Run Mode)

- Turn system power switch OFF
- Turn key switch to the DN position & then turn power ON, After powered on release key switch.

IMPORTANT: Using the boat lift in AUTO RUN mode carries inherent risks. Any issues with the lift or motor may result in a DELAYED response by user to STOP the lift. Users are solely responsible for ALL risks in AUTO RUN mode, including motor malfunctions, lift collisions, limit or sensor problems, and unforeseen issues & obstacles related to hoisting the vessel.

SENSOR FAILURE: In case of a sensor malfunction, the motor stops for safety. An alarm and voice warning activate if the sensor isn't detected within 1.2 seconds. Possible issues include a failed sensor, broken wire, or missing/detected magnet. The voice warning indicates removal of all limits; the unit returns to normal mode. Users must resolve the sensor or magnet problem and reset limits before re-entering Auto Run mode.




BOAT LIFT MOTOR – 12v & 24v CONFIGURATION
